

Minibus taxi driver and conductor

Protect yourself and passengers from coronavirus (COVID-19)

COVID-19 is similar to flu, causing cough, fever, sore throat, fatigue and aching muscles.

When a person with COVID-19 coughs or sneezes, they leave the virus on surfaces and in the air. You can catch COVID-19 if:

- You touch these surfaces and then touch your face, eyes, nose or mouth or
- You have close contact (1,5 metres) with a person who has coronavirus.

Always wear a cloth mask when going out in public spaces.

5 Golden Rules

1. Wash hands
2. Don't touch face
3. Keep apart
4. Cover your cough
5. Sick? Stay home

Prepare your minibus taxi before use

Clean the outside of the minibus taxi:

- Wash your minibus taxi daily with soap and water.
- Disinfect with diluted bleach solution (6 teaspoons of bleach in 1 litre water). Wear gloves when cleaning and disinfecting.

6x teaspoons



Clean the inside of the minibus taxi:

- Wipe down the door handles, window ledges and seats with dilute bleach solution (6 teaspoons of bleach in 1 litre water).
- Leave the windows open.



Use a cloth mask safely

1

Wash your hands. Place the inside against your face, cover the nose and mouth. Make sure it fits well, don't touch the cloth part.



2

Do NOT TOUCH YOUR FACE or fiddle with the mask. Remove the mask if it is wet.



Do not share masks with others.

3

Only touch the straps to take mask off and avoid touching objects and surfaces until you washed your hands.



4

Wash mask with soap and water, dry and iron to disinfect it. Have at least 2 masks so that you have a clean one ready.



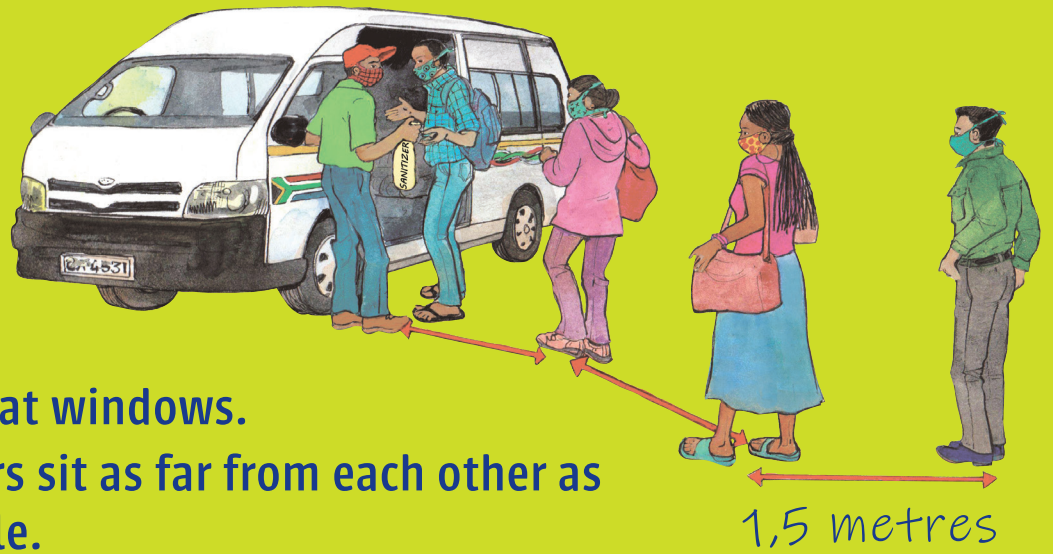

Loading your minibus taxi

- While waiting for passengers, leave doors open.
- Queue marshal to encourage customers to stand 1,5 metres apart.
- Spray alcohol-based hand sanitiser on passengers' hands before they enter.
- Fill up taxi from the back seat. Place passengers at windows.



- Let passengers sit as far from each other as possible.

- Do not exceed 70% of licensed capacity:
 - 23-seater: 15 passengers + 1 driver
 - 16-seater: 10 passengers + 1 driver
 - 11-seater: 7 passengers + 1 driver



After each trip

Wipe down the door handles, window ledges and seats with diluted bleach solution (6 teaspoons of bleach in 1 litre water).

During each trip

- Keep the windows open.
- Avoid handling money if possible. Use box or tin to accept cash payments.
- If handling money, clean hands with alcohol-based sanitiser. Do not touch your face. Sanitise after each payment. Offer sanitiser to passengers after payments.
- Open and close the doors for passengers. Avoid people touching the door or door handles.



When you get home

- Remove shoes and leave outside before entering home.
- Thoroughly wash hands and arms as soon as you enter your home.
- Remove work clothes and cloth mask (without touching the outside surface)
 - Put work clothes into a separate bag for washing. Wash mask separately.
 - Immediately have hot shower/bath/wash.
 - Avoid hugs, kisses and direct contact with family members until after shower/bath/wash.
